## The Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rich Fruit Cake Competition

Recipe required to compete in Class H: Section 14.

### RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

#### Ingredients

250g	Sultanas
250g	Chopped Raisins
250g	Currants
125g	Chopped Mixed Peel
90g	Chopped Red Glaze Cherries
90g	Chopped Blanched Almonds
1/3 cup	Sherry or Brandy
250g	Plain Flour
60g	Self – Raising Flour
¼ Teaspoon	Grated Nutmeg
½ Teaspoon	Ground Ginger
½ Teaspoon	Ground Cloves
250g	Butter
250g	Soft Brown Sugar
½ Teaspoon	Lemon Essence or Finely Grated Lemon Rind
½ Teaspoon	Almond Essence
½ Teaspoon	Vanilla Essence
4	Large Eggs

#### Method

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
4. Place the mixture into a prepared tin **square 20cm x 20cm (8' x 8') tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
5. NOTE:- To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

### BOILED CARROT LOAF RECIPE

#### Ingredients

1 cup	Grated Carrot
¾ cup	Chopped Raisins
¾ cup	Water
¾ cup	Castor Sugar
30g	Butter
½ Teaspoon	Ground Cinnamon
½ Teaspoon	Ground Nutmeg
¾ cup	Self – Raising Flour
¾ cup	Plain Flour
½ Teaspoon	Bicarb Soda
½ cup	Chopped Walnuts

#### Method

1. Combine carrot, raisins, water, sugar, butter, cinnamon and nutmeg in a saucepan. Stir over heat without boiling until sugar is dissolved.
2. Bring to the boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer for 10 minutes.
3. Cool to room temperature.
4. Stir in half the sifted flours and soda mixture, then remaining flour and walnuts. Spread into prepared loaf tin.
5. Bake in slow oven (150 – 160C) for about an hour, or until cooked.
6. Stand for 5 minutes before turning out.
