Suggested Structure & Document Purpose

| Document | Primary Purpose | Suggested Focus |
|--|---|--|
| Code of Conduct | Expected behaviour and values for all participants and individuals | Focus on values, behaviour standards, respect, inclusivity, and the consequences for breaches across all levels . This applies to everyone (public, exhibitors, officials) and reinforces the culture of respect and safety. |
| General Regulations | Rules for exhibitors, competitors, commercial traders, volunteers, and officials | Focus on competition, exhibit rules, responsibilities, judging, animal welfare, biosecurity, safety, protests, and penalties . This governs participants' behaviour & responsibilities in competitions and trading, not general attendees. |
| Conditions of Entry to Showgrounds | Conditions of entry for patrons and visitors to the Showground | Focus on the terms for public entry , including safety, prohibited items, media consent, and general visitor conduct. This is essentially a public-facing document like a "Ticket Terms & Conditions". |

Summary Benefits of This Approach

Clear Roles & Responsibilities:

- Everyone follows the Code of Conduct.
- Patrons follow Conditions of Entry to Showgrounds.
- Exhibitors, Traders Officials follow General Regulations.

Reduced Repetition:

- Common behaviour expectations (respect, safety, animal welfare) live in the **Code of Conduct**, not repeated everywhere.

Cross-Referencing:

- Each document references the others, so users know where to look.

Easy Updating:

- If behavioural standards change, only the **Code of Conduct** needs updating, not all documents.
