

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

9am Start Conditions for Horse Events

Competitors compete at their own risk. Junior competitors under 18 years of age are the direct responsibility of their parents or guardians. The Tooraweenah PA&H committee recommends the wearing of approved ASA safety helmets in all events. Horse to be under the full control of their rider/handler at all times. It is a requirement of competitors in all competitions to sign a waiver form and wear the wristband provided. Drug testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC disputes and disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee.

Entries: Are accepted at the committee's discretion. The chief steward has the right to change or amend any event. The steward's and judge's decision is final. Only stewards and judges are allowed in the ring. All competitors are to be suitably attired.

Stallions: Led stallions to be shown with a bit or chain. Stallions are to be under the control of a handler/rider over the age of 18 years at all times. Stallions are only eligible to compete in events stated.

Prize Money: For Rings 1, 2, 3, 4, 5A, 5B and 6, is payable in the Ring. First place \$5 and ribbon, second place \$2 and ribbon, third place ribbon only.

Horse Stalls: Portable horse yards are available for hire at a cost of \$5 per day. Please book with Chief Ring Steward to ensure you get a yard.

Some Tips for Competition Cooking



- Cakes generally should be baked an even colour all round, risen evenly with no crust or peaks on top. Icing, if stated, should only be on top.
- 2. Remove any lining paper from cakes, line tins carefully without creases.
- Fruit Cakes all fruit to be cut the same size, particularly cherries, nuts, (but not too finely), not over flavoured with spirits.
- 4. Orange cakes should be baked in a loaf tin.
- 5. Sponges the two layers should be the same depth (weigh tins), spread very thinly with raspberry jam, no sifted icing sugar on top. Definitely no rack marks (a good rule for all cakes, turn out onto a tea towel).
- 6. Lamingtons cut daintily approximately 4cm square, coconut not soaked in.
- Biscuits must be crisp, dainty size, delicate golden colour. Generally each variety same size.
- Jams presented in jars which are clearly labelled, lids to be covered if commercial, set but not rubbery, fruit soft, jam clear, no mould.
