

- Indemnity and Waiver Forms: Competitors taking part in the horse section of the Delegate Show do so at their own risk.
- Each adult competitor **MUST** sign a waiver form before they compete in ANY event.
- Waiver forms must be completed by a parent or guardian for any competitor under 18 years of age
- PIC: All horses must be entered with PIC number. No PIC no ride.
- District: Events are open to horses and riders residing in the former Bombala Council area and the former North Riding of the former Orbest Shire.
- Local Horse Rules: Horses must be stabled in the area for 30 days. Junior show jump horses to be owned by competitors, parent or guardian thereof.
- Measuring No official measuring will take place at the show, But if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be made by the ring master or chief steward and will be final.
- REGISTERED AUSTRALIAN STOCK HORSES: Registration papers must be produced if asked for by the Judge.
- RESERVE CHAMPIONS: When a Champion Ribbon has been awarded, the competitor/exhibit which gained second place to the Champion in the preceding individual class shall then be eligible to come forward to compete for Reserve Champion, together with the other first prize winners.
- A Novice rider or horse is one that has not won a first prize at any show.
- Prize winners are required to take part in the parade of prize winners.
- All horse events are run under peak body rules.







THE ASC RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

Here's what you need:

250g (8oz) Sultanas
250g (8oz) Chopped raisins
250g (8oz) Currants
125g (4oz) Chopped mixed peel
90g (3oz) Red glace cherries
90g (3oz) Chopped blanched almonds
½ Cup sherry or brandy
250g (8oz) Plain flour
60g (2oz) Self raising flour
¼ Tsp. Grated nutmeg
½ Tsp. Ground ginger
½ Tsp. Ground cloves
250g (8oz) Butter
250g (8oz) Soft brown sugar
½ Tsp. Lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
½ Tsp. Almond essence
½ Tsp. Vanilla essence
4 Large eggs

Here's what you do:

Mix together all of the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably over night.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hrs. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note:

To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces; cherries into 4- 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at Country Shows will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a group final to be conducted by each of the 14 groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.
Winner to receive \$50 prize money .

The winner of this class at the Delegate Show will be required to bake another cake in order to compete in the group final at the Cooma Show.

The 14 winners at the Regional Level will be required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the final judging at the Royal Easter Show.

Show Cooking Hints

Plates: Please use paper plates where possible, ensure that they are larger than the cake and they are as flat as possible.

Cakes should not hang over the sides or the plate/board.

Place both plate/board in a plastic bag. Do not use cling wrap.

Making Cakes for Showing.

Cakes should be evenly cooked, with good texture and no large holes when cake is cut.

There should be no dents on the outside of the cake. If the tin is required to be lined, just line the bottom of the tin, not up the sides, unless it is a fruit cake.

Cut paper to the size of the bottom by tracing around the tin.

Allow cakes, muffins or cup cakes to stand before turning them out onto a cooler.

Place towel and paper over the cooler so no wire marks appear on the bottom of the cake/s.

Do not place hot cakes onto plates as they sweat and stick onto the plate.

Fruit cakes can be made the weekend before the show.

Date Loaf, butter cakes, muffins, biscuits and slices can be made on the Wednesday or Thursday.

Sponges, scones, pikelets on Thursday afternoon or night.

Scones: When cooking scones do not place too much flour on surface that they are being made on.

Wipe excess flour from scones once they are cooked.

Lamingtons: are judged on texture and daintiness. They should be of all equal size and 5cm square.

Slices: should be cut into 4cm squares. Do not show the slice pieces that were cooked on the edge of the tin.

No cakes are to be cooked in ring tins.
