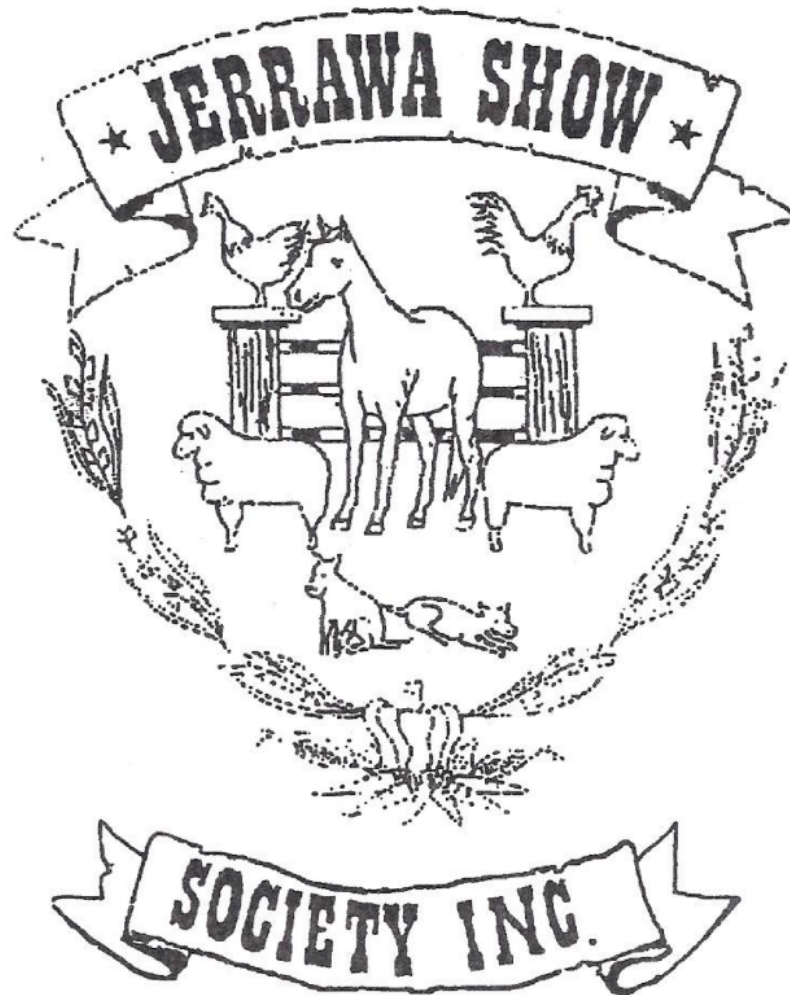

Jerrawa Show Society – Exhibition By-Laws

1. Entries for all exhibits, whether competitive or otherwise, should take place at an early date, on a form obtained from the Secretary and signed by the exhibitor. The entry fee shall accompany entries, and no entry shall be entered in more than one class, with the exception of the Horse Section,
2. The entry of all live exhibits will be taken as a guarantee that it is free from disease and the exhibitor of such animal will be held liable for any infringement of this rule.
3. When there are four or less entries in any class, only 1st prize money will be awarded.
4. The gates will open from 6:00am and exhibits will be received by the Stewards from 7:00am on the morning of the show. Livestock must be inside the grounds before 10:00am unless otherwise stated, with the exception of the horse section.
5. Exhibitors shall, under the direction of the stewards, arrange their exhibits. No exhibit must afterwards be removed without the sanction of the stewards, under penalty of being removed from the ground and forfeiture of any prize money that may be awarded to it. Neither the Jerrawa Show Society or nor the Stewards shall incur any responsibility for removal, without consent, of any exhibit.
6. The committee shall have the power to refuse admission to the show ground, or order the removal of any exhibit, that may reasonably be suspected to be diseased or dangerous.
7. All exhibits shall be deemed to be in charge of the exhibitor throughout the exhibition and, although care & accommodation of exhibits are given due diligence, the Jerrawa Show Society takes no responsibility & incurs no liability for damage or loss in respect of the exhibits, however occasioned.
8. Persons in charge of exhibits must, during the show, conform to the direction of the committee, as to placing, custody & removal of their exhibits & if required by the judges or stewards, to stand aside during the judging. Any breach of the rule, render the exhibitor to be deprived of any prize that may be awarded.
9. No exhibit is to be removed from the grounds during the show, without formal permit signed by the Secretary & no exhibit may be removed before 4:30pm, excluding horse section.
10. The Jerrawa Show Society shall not hold itself responsible for any accident that may occur through any exhibit at the show, & it shall be a condition of entry, that each exhibitor & all persons attending the show shall hold the Jerrawa Show Society harmless & indemnify it against legal proceedings, from any such accident.
11. The Jerrawa Show Society shall not hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or misdelivery of livestock or other exhibits at the show.
12. The agricultural pavilion will be cleared at 4:30pm on the day of the show, of persons & the pavilion will then be opened for the removal of exhibits, when exhibitors or their agents shall be in attendance to take delivery of their respective exhibits. Any exhibit removed from the pavilion by any exhibitor or agent prior to the stated time, is liable to forfeiture of any prizes won.
13. The award of the judge shall be final unless protested against. All such protests must be handed to the Secretary, in writing within 1 hour of the award being presented & must be accompanied by a fee of \$10. If the protest is upheld, the judges will place the other exhibits of the class, in their order of merit. If the protest is dismissed, the fee will be retained by The Jerrawa Show Society.

Jerrawa Show Society – Exhibition By-Laws

14. Stewards must be in attendance at the showground at the hour appointed (7:00am) to receive exhibits. They are responsible for classification of all exhibits & placing exhibits together for judging. They will obtain entry books from the Secretary, deliver them to the judge & direct them to the exhibits they are appointed to judge. At the close of the show, all exhibitors shall remove their exhibits & stewards will mark them off the books.
15. Exhibitors of livestock may be required to furnish full particulars as to the age of each exhibit, & such information, as the committee may demand. The committee reserves the right to disqualify any exhibit improperly entered or regarding which any false statement has been made.
16. Sheep exhibits may be removed after 4:30pm on the day of the show.
17. A Health Declaration form must be completed & furnished by all sheep exhibitors. A declaration form is included in this schedule.

Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Rich Fruit Cake Competition

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

Rich Fruit Cake

Here's what you will need:

250g (8 oz) sultanas
250g (8 oz) chopped raisins
250g (8 oz) currants
125g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
90 g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries
90 g (3 oz) blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy
250g (8 oz) plain flour
60g (2 oz) self raising flour
¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
½ teaspoon ground ginger
½ teaspoon ground cloves
250g (8 oz) butter
250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon lemon essence OR
Finely grated lemon rind
½ teaspoon almond essence
½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 – 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 – 4 pieces.
