The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants:

250g sultanas	250 g chopped raisins
250 g currants	125 g chopped mixed peel
90 g chopped red glace cherries	90 g chopped blanched almonds
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	
250 g plain flour	60 g self-raising flour
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves	250g butter
250g soft brown sugar	4 large eggs
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence	OR finely grated lemon rind
1/2 teaspoon almond essence	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces. (The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (570mm).)

Winners at country shows will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a semi final to be conducted by each of the 14 groups of Agricultural Society's Council of NSW. The 14 winners at regional level will each receive a cash prize of \$15.00 and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$50.00.

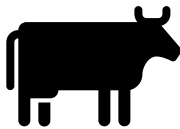
